Main aims


- Map the approaches and systems of practices of resettlement and humanitarian admission programmes and schemes across the EU and Norway;

- Map the practices and approaches to private sponsorship schemes.






Background: Resettlement and humanitarian admission in a wider context

Persons resettled or admitted under humanitarian admission by per 1 million inhabitants (2011-2015)




Resettlement and humanitarian admission 2011-2015

Positive decisions on asylum applications 2011-2015





Starting up resettlement schemes:

CY, HR, LT, LV, MT

- Identification and screening:
 - UNHCR
 - Selection missions and dossier selection
- Criteria for selection and prioritisation
- Information and cultural orientation
- Transfer





Post-arrival: integration



<u>Accommodation</u>

- Reception centres (short-term)
- Private/social/cou ncil housing (longterm) (Duration varies)
- Geographical distribution



Employment

- Vocational orientation, counselling
- Assistance in entering the labour market



Education

- Information and cultural orientation
- Language training
- School registration



Healthcare

- Medical check-up upon arrival
- Specialised healthcare
- Access to full services (longterm)




Welfare

- In-kind support (short-term);
- Guaranteed
 Minimum Income support;

Other

- Legal and social support/counselling
- Housing market support
- Family reunification support

Interest in private sponsorship schemes: BE, FR

 Long selection procedures and delays in actual transfers; Logistical obstacles in third countries; Meeting specific needs of vulnerable persons and changing characteristics of families Providing pre-departure information and orientation and managing expectations Organizational challenges in coordinating with various stakeholders Ensuring sufficient resources and capacity for implementation 	 Ensuring housing/accommodation Availability of language courses Time planning and dealing with short-term arrivals Meeting needs for specialised support; Access to employment 	 Coordination between authorities Adequate information and cultural orientation Early medical assessment Access to housing as facilitator of integration Role of local communities and volunteers
