

On the edge of Europe, Great Dervent is the first stop on the path to freedom for thousands of refugees. The local postman believes that refugees can save and revive his dying town but, in his campaign, faces resistance from some of his fellow villagers. The documentary received several awards.





Someone took away your life and totally turned it upside down. Will you learn to live a new life?"
