Admission criteria

Qualifications; skills; income levels; sectors; contract duration; volumes of admission; labour market test; shortage occupations; country of origin

Duration of stay

facilitate permanence vs. safeguarding return; circular (facilitating (temporary) return)

Equal treatment

With nationals; EU posted workers; national derogations; timelapsed

Procedures

Single procedures for work and stay; Fast-tracking trust-worthy employers; clear institutional design; low fees; give reasoning; legal remedies

Employee mobility

Right to switch employer, switch sector; be self-employed

Family

reunification & their right to work/dual careers

Future-proof 'new' narratives for EU migration policy towards 2030?

Demographic changes

- EC: Engaging already present TCN \triangleright (refugees, students) is not enough....EU is losing battle for brains
- Sustainable Development Goals & Ш. Migration 2030
 - Target 10.7 SDG: "to facilitate orderly, safe," regular and responsible migration" [UN **Global Compacts**]
- III. New Pact on Migration & Asylum (COM/2020/609)
 - Includes Talent Partnerships/Pools in cooperation with countries of origin (triple-win)
- IV. COVID-19: (practically) skilled migrants are essential workers

Response 1: Article 2 TEU

Struggle for Skills: requires a welcoming* migration policy for (practically) skilled workers based on human dignity

Response 2: Article 80 TFEU

Creating legal pathways is a shared responsibilty: it requires solidarity across-the-board though 'needs' differ per MS

Response 3: Article 3(2) TEU
